Aug. 1988 – Oct. 1991: apprenticeship (3 years) and entry at the Ghent bar, with a focus on family law.

Oct. 1988 – Jan. 1991: part time researcher at the Ghent University, Centre for Children's Rights, with Prof. E. Verhellen. Research project for the Minister of Internal Affairs on 'Minors and the Police', preparation of seminars on juvenile justice and juvenile delinquency, work on the legal position of minors.

Oct. 1991– June 1998: advisor in Child & Family, a Flemish public agency, working on early child care, prevention and family support. I worked as a legal advisor on ombudswork, on adoption, on child abuse, on refugee issues and was also training the staff on family law issues and children's rights.

June 1998 – June 2009: appointed by the Flemish Parliament as first Flemish Children's Rights Commissioner. (for all information, in Flemish, [www.kinderrechtencommissariaat.be](http://www.kinderrechtencommissariaat.be)). Actively involved in the European Network of Ombudsmen for Children.

March 2009 – Oct. 2010: technical expert for the working group on Child Friendly Justice of the Council of Europe, drafting the guidelines and memorandum for child friendly justice. Followed by several public presentations and articles on the topic of child friendly justice.

Aug. 2009 – march 2011:

- (90%) policy advisor for the Flemish Central Authority for Inter-country Adoption.
- (10%) Independent advisor on children's rights issues

Some of the projects I am or have been involved in for VBJK:

- **Social Inclusion, Education and urban policy for young children (2017 – 2019) – Erasmus+**

In this project, partners from 5 countries, work towards developing a competence framework and educational framework for inclusive ECEC. Inclusion is considered to be a broad concept, a process towards involving all children in high quality ECEC: children with special needs, children living in poverty, children with a migration/asylum background and so forth. The combination of partners in academics, from practice and local policy level makes this project quite interesting and rich in bringing different perspectives together.

- **Multilingual early childhood education and care for young refugee children (2017-2019) Erasmus +**

The overall objective of this project is to enhance the quality of Early Childhood Education and Care for young refugee children (age 0-4) by providing tools to educators, child care professionals and policy makers. The project focuses on issues of accessibility (and availability) and language learning, since both elements can facilitate refugee children's wellbeing, development and further integration in their new countries. While primary education seems quite accessible to this group of children, this is often not the case for ECEC provision. In the project inspiring practices will be collected and analysed and a toolbox will be developed for ECEC professionals working specifically with young refugee children.

- **NESET II (2018) research paper**

PPMI (Vilnius) is coordinating a research paper on 'Role and place of ECEC in integrated work benefiting vulnerable groups, such as Roma', where VBJK will be involved in drafting part of the content on integrated work as well as conducting 3 case studies.

- **INTESYS project (2016-2019) – Erasmus +**

This project is looking into different ways of integrated working (across sectors, across age groups, across policy levels...) to better serve the needs of children and families in vulnerable living conditions (poverty, minorities...) Potential benefits of integrated work can be found on the level of efficiency, accessibility and overall quality. Surveys will be made on local and European level, as well as pilots on integrated working in 4 partner countries. Also, innovative tools will be developed and policy recommendations will be drafted.

- **Transatlantic Forum on Inclusive Early Years (2012 - 2016)**

VBJK and MPI (US) are the operational partners in this Forum, under the umbrella of the Belgian King Baudouin Foundation and funded by a consortium of several European and American foundations. In the course of 7 high level meetings, current issues on inclusive early years are being discussed by academics, practitioners and policy makers. VBJK co-organised meetings on (the lack of) accessibility of ECEC services, on professionalization, on parent involvement, on evaluation of ECEC services, on integrated systems, on multilingualism. The final meeting will be in Torino in February 2016, after which some project-publications will be prepared

- **Social inclusion in childcare provisions in Brussels (2007-2010)**

Action research project in Brussels under the authority of the Commission of the Flemish Community to increase the accessibility in early childhood care and education for vulnerable groups. This project ran for about 10 years and VBJK provided professional support for over 80 childcare centres in learning communities as well as training on diversity and social policy

- **EQUAP, (2014-2017) – Erasmus+**

Enhancing Quality through Participation, and Erasmus+ project on parent involvement in ECEC in the 7 partner countries, including research on different policies and indicators as well as job shadowing activities among ECEC practitioners.

- **IMPRES Improving Preschool Education in Serbia (2013-2014)**

In this project, I was responsible, together with the project partners, to write a manual on actions and strategies to enhance access to preschool for children from vulnerable groups and to work on diversification of programs.
